# **2024 Election Schedule**

# **Primary Election:**

Registration Deadline: July 22, 2024 Early Vote: August 10-17, 2024

8:30am-6:00pm

Election Day: August 20, 2024 Polls Open: 7:00am-7:00pm

# **General Election:**

Registration Deadline: October 7, 2024 Early Vote: October 21– November 2, 2024

8:30am-6:00pm

Election Day: November 5, 2024 Polls Open: 7:00am-7:00pm

**Identification Requirements:** In order to vote you must present a current and valid picture/signature identification. It can be one form, such as a Florida driver 's license or Florida issued ID, or two separate forms of identification. A provisional ballot will be issued if you do not have proper ID.

**Voting System in Okeechobee County:** Instructions on how to use the voting system will be available at the polling locations during early voting and on Election Day.

# **Voter's Bill of Rights**

#### Each registered voter in this state has the right to:

- 1. Vote and have his or her vote accurately counted.
- 2. Cast a vote if he or she is in line at the official closing of polls in that county.
- 3. Ask for and receive assistance in voting.
- 4. Receive up to two replacement ballots if he or she makes a mistake prior to the ballot being cast.
- 5. An explanation if his or her registration or identity is in question.
- 6. If his or her registration or identity is in question, cast a provisional ballot.
- 7. Written instructions to use when voting, and, upon request, oral instructions in voting from elections officers.
- 8. Vote free from coercion or intimidation by elections officers or any other person.
- 9. Vote on a voting system that is in working condition and that will allow votes to be accurately cast.

# **Voter Responsibilities**

#### Each registered voter in this state should:

- 1. Familiarize himself or herself with the candidates and issues.
- 2. Maintain with the office of the Supervisor of Elections a current address.
- 3. Know the location of his or her polling place and its hours of operation.
- 4. Bring proper identification to the polling station.
- 5. Familiarize himself or herself with the operation of the voting equipment in his or her precinct.
- 6. Treat precinct workers with courtesy.
- 7. Respect the privacy of other voters.
- 8. Report any problems or violations of election laws to the Supervisor of Elections.
- 9. Ask questions, if needed.
- 10.Make sure that his or her completed ballot is correct before leaving the polling station.

**NOTE TO VOTER:** Failure to perform any of these responsibilities does not prohibit a voter from voting.

## How to Register or Update Voter Signature or Information:

You may pick up an application from one of the following locations:

or you may call the elections office and a form will be mailed to you. You may also visit our website at http://www.voteokeechobee.gov where you will find an easy to complete online registration form.

Once you have completed your voter registration application, mail or deliver it to the Elections Office. A voter information card will be mailed to you.

# **Registration Information Cont.**

Requirements to Register: You may register to vote if you are:

- •a U.S. Citizen
- •a resident of the State of Florida (your county of residence)
- •18 years of age (you may pre-register at 16)
- •If you are a felon with rights restored
- •You must register at least 29 days prior to voting in any Election.

**To Remain a Voter:** Registration is permanent as long as you remain a qualified voter and a resident of Florida. Please **keep** your **address current** with the Supervisor of Elections. As failure to do so may result in the cancellation of your registration. You may **change your address**, by phone, in person or in writing. However, if you **change your party** OR **change your name** by marriage or other legal process, you must complete a new voter application.

**Precinct Changes:** In the case of redistricting or a change of polling location, you will be sent a new Voter Information Card with all your updated information.

**Party Affiliation:** You may choose to register in a political party (major or minor) or register with no party affiliation. You may change your party affiliation, however the completed application must be submitted least 29 days prior to a primary election.

## **Voting Information**

**What is a Closed Primary?** Florida is a closed primary state. In a primary election, registered voters may only vote for candidates in their party of registration. By not selecting a party when you register, your vote is limited in the primary election to nonpartisan races and issues. In the general election, you may vote for any candidate, regardless of party affiliation.

#### **EXCEPTION**: UNIVERSAL PRIMARY CONTEST

If all candidates have the same party affiliation and the winner will have no opposition in the general election, then <u>ALL</u> qualified voters may vote on that "Universal Primary Contest" in the primary election.

**Election Day Voting:** Voting in a precinct in which you do not live is illegal. You must vote only at the precinct in which you reside. You are encouraged to report any changes in your registration (i.e., address, name, party affiliation) to the Elections Office. A current and valid picture/signature ID is required.

**Vote by Mail (Absentee):** Any registered voter may apply by mail, phone, e-mail, or in person to the Elections Office for an absentee ballot. Absentee ballots will not be forwarded, so please keep your address updated. An absentee ballot must be received by your Elections Office no later than 7 p.m. Election Day. Your signature will be verified so to ensure your absentee ballot gets accepted, please keep an up to date signature on file with our office.

**Early Voting:** The law permits voters to vote in person prior to election day. Early Voting begins up to 15 days before election day and ends the Saturday before election day. A current and valid picture/signature ID is required.

**Provisional Ballots:** The law permits voters to who are potentially ineligible or lacking a valid form of identification to vote a provisional ballot.
